Obligations

Membership in the National Honor Society brings certain obligations to the members. Obligations of members include payment of an induction fee to cover the cost of shirts and pins [There is a fund that can cover this cost for students who have financial problems], participation in the fundraising activity of the organization, completion of ten service hours each semester, attending chapter meetings, and being a positive role model on and off the school campus. Failure to fulfill these obligations leads to a review of the member's status.

According to the constitution and bylaws, members who do not fulfill certain obligations <u>may</u> be dismissed from membership. The bylaws state the following reasons for possible dismissal:

- a. violation of school rules (truancy, in-school suspension, out-of-school suspension)
- b. commission of a civil offense
- c. not maintaining the standards of service, leadership, scholarship or character that were the basis for one's selection
- d. not maintaining active membership (for example, consistently missing the NHS meetings, not fulfilling service projects)
